


“*5 For this reason I left you in Crete, that you should set in order the things that are lacking, and appoint elders in every city as I commanded you— 6 if a man is blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of dissipation or insubordination. 7 For a bishop must be blameless, as a steward of God, not self-willed, not quick-tempered, not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, 8 but hospitable, a lover of what is good, sober-minded, just, holy, self-controlled, 9 holding fast the faithful word as he has been taught, that he may be able, by sound doctrine, both to exhort and convict those who contradict.*”

⇒ The Reason for the Assignment

God has a plan for all of us.

“Crete of the hundred cities” **hecatopolis**

It had an extensive coastline, and many of Crete’s cities were connected by sea as well as roads on land.



- **To set in order the things that are lacking.**



What does this look like?

"That phrase is a medical term; it was applied to the setting of a crooked limb." (Wiersbe) There were crooked things that had to be set straight among the congregations of Crete.

A good leader can identify problems and come up with solutions.

III. Looking for deer in the woods

The churches in Crete were "crooked" due to significant structural and moral "lacks" that Titus was commissioned to straighten:

- **Lack of Leadership:** Paul instructed Titus to **appoint elders** in every city to provide stable, godly governance.
- **Doctrinal Error:** Rebellious teachers and those focused on "Jewish myths" were **disrupting whole households** for dishonest gain.
- **Cultural Immorality:** The Cretan culture was notoriously difficult, famously described by one of their own as "liars, evil brutes, [and] lazy gluttons".
- **Spiritual Inconsistency:** Many professed to know God but **denied Him by their actions**, appearing detestable and unfit for good work.

Just as a physician meticulously resets a bone so it can heal properly, Titus was to use **sound doctrine** and **godly leadership** to bring health and order back to these congregations.

Making changes is very hard to accomplish!

1 Corinthians 11:34- And if any man hunger, let him eat at home; that ye come not together unto condemnation. And the rest will I **set in order** when I come.

- **To ordain elders in every city.**

Proper leadership is imperative for successful results. But remember, it's not caused by the leader, but God only.

Well, the preacher he's too young. And, maybe he's too old.
The sermons they're not hard enough. And, maybe they're too bold.

He needs to have more dignity. Or, else he's way too proud.

Well, the sermons they're too long. And, maybe they're too short.

He ought to preach the word with dignity instead of "stomp and snort."
Well, that preacher we've got must be "the world's most stuck up man."
Well, one of the lady's told me the other day, "Well, he didn't even shake my hand."

Life Application Bible Commentary has an excellent summary statement on elder qualifications

"Notice that most of the qualifications involve character, not knowledge or skill. A person's life-style and relationships provide a window into his or her character. Consider these qualifications as you evaluate people for positions of leadership in your church. It is important to have leaders who can effectively preach God's Word; but even more importantly, they must live out God's Word and be examples for others to follow."

This is not about finding someone sinless.

Blameless

Anegkletos ("not convicted, not found guilty") refers to character (behavior) that stands up when correctly tried, not convictable when evaluated by sound rules of evidence.

1 Timothy 3:10- And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacon, being *found* blameless.

III. Elder material

- Going to seminary doesn't make one qualified for spiritual leadership.
- Being a good talker doesn't make one qualified for spiritual leadership.
- Natural or spiritual gifts in themselves do not qualify one for spiritual leadership.
- What one gives in money or volunteer time does not qualify them for spiritual leadership.
- **What qualifies a man for spiritual leadership is godly character — and godly character established according to the clear criteria Paul will list.**

1 Timothy 3

The husband of one wife (A one woman man)

A one woman husband doesn't just happen.

This has much more to do with character.

Ephesians 5 and 1 Peter 3

- ✓ **A man who loves his wife**
- ✓ **A man who compliments his wife**
- ✓ **A man who adores his wife**
- ✓ **A man who leads his wife**

Proverbs 31:10-12; 23, 26-31

□ **Faithful children**

1 Timothy 3

Faithful children don't just happen.

- ✓ **There must be a concerted effort of both parents.**
- ✓ **There must be a godly example to follow.**
- ✓ **There must be boundaries set.**
- ✓ **There must be instructions given.**
- ✓ **There must be a plan for a relationship with Jesus.**

III. Brushing teeth

1 Peter 4:4- Wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, G810 speaking evil of you:

ἀνυπότακτος anypótaktos, an-oo-pot'-ak-tos; from G1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of G5293; unsubdued, i.e. insubordinate (in fact or temper):— disobedient, that is not put under, unruly.
